




Netting Repair Instructions




Warning! Repair the netting outdoors or in a well ventilated area, as a lighter is required to metlt the frayed ends of the repair sttrings.




Step 1 - Remove any broken strings. Tie a repair string to the closest whole string. Loop the replacement string around the next whole string.




Step 2 - Knot the replacement string to the strand.




Step 3 - Create another loop of string around the loose knot.




Step 4 - Knot the replacement string to the strand again.




Step 5 - Pull the knot tight.



Step 6 - Pass the repair string through the next whole square.



Step 7 - Create a loop around the next whole strand.




Step 8 - Knot the replacement string to the strand.



Step 9 - Create oanother loop of string around the loose knot.




 $\mbox{\bf Step 10}$ - Knot the replacement string to the strand again and pull tight.



Step 11 - Trim any loose strands, leaving about 1cm each end for the next step.



Step 12 - Use a lighter to gently melt the ends of the string to prevent fraying. WARNING! Do not hold the flames too close to the string as it could catch fire. Practice on some offcuts if you are unsure.



Step 13 - Repeat on any other damaged sections.
